1.2 **Notes and preparations**



WARNING

The "Information sheet for wheel mounting on the Audi Q5 (FY)" should be enclosed with the general owner's manual. The customer should be made aware of the specific points in person during handover.



∕!\ WARNING

The installation instructions and the corresponding approval documents must be handed over to the customer.

The customer is to be informed that the approval documents must remain in the vehicle.

- 1. Before the running boards are installed, you must be familiar with the installation restrictions that apply for the vehicle ⇒ "Electronic parts catalogue ETKA". Adherence to the relevant restrictions is mandatory.
- 2. Read the installation instructions carefully before you begin.
 - Audi AG shall not accept responsibility in the event of failure to comply with these installation instruc-
 - Non-compliance with these installation instructions and notes will compromise your safety and that of third parties.
- 3. Prior to beginning the installation, check that you have all the components from the scope of delivery.
- 4. Always maintain a high level of cleanliness thoroughly clean all equipment areas and contact surfaces.

1.3 Notes on assembly

- 1. The assembly, repair and replacement of parts is to be carried out by an authorised workshop. Genuine spare parts available from your AUDI partner must always be used.
- 2. Improper installation and use of unsuitable tools can cause damage to the vehicle or the add-parts.
- 3. Recommendation: The running board should be installed by two people.
- 4. Special tools, aids and materials are required to perform the installation:
 - Rivet setting tool for pop rivets M8 (pop rivet studs & pop rivet nuts) Recommendation: Rivkle
 P2007 from Böllhoff
 - Body saw -VAS 5108 oder VAS 6598 oder VAS 6780-
 - Use the coarse hacksaw blade included in the body saw -VAS 5108 oder VAS 6598 oder VAS 6780set.
 - Hand-held drill
 - HSS drill bit (∅ 3.0/∅ 7.0/∅ 9.0/∅ 10.0)
 - A wide range of socket sets: spanner and multi-point socket head tool including extensions and joints.
 - Socket for removing the underseal
 - Torque wrench (1-5 Nm)
 - Torque wrench (20-50 Nm)
 - 10-mm multi-point socket insert with square drive, 8 mm AF
 - Wedge -3409-
 - Utility knife, scraper
 - Key files, triangular file (edge length 5 mm)
 - Surface protection and bodywork sealant (see Workshop Manual for bodywork repairs)
 - Adhesive sealant: AKD 476.KD5.05 (320 ml)
 - Benzine, isopropanol and cleaning cloths
 - Threadlocking adhesive D 000.600.A2
- 5. The illustrations show only the driver's side, the passenger side should be treated as a mirror image. Deviations from this principle are shown separately.
- 6. The add-on component is precision-made. Before installing the component, check it for any damage or quality defects.
- 7. All unsealed surfaces resulting from the following body processing work:
 - Local removal of the underseal
 - Drilling and filing of mounting holes
 - Unintentional damage to surfaces (e.g. scratches/scoring) caused during removal of the underseal must be handled in accordance with the "VW Group Paintwork Guideline – Corrosion Protection".
 Corrosion protection must be properly re-established.
- 8. The PVC seam must be reduced/removed in the areas where the holding profiles/support braces are in contact with the PVC when they are screwed on to the vehicle and are influenced/distorted as a result of this. Non-compliance with these instructions can result in a setting loss that has a significant negative affect on the tightening torque.





1.4 Information for working with the assembly adhesive

- 1. Observe the expiry date of the assembly adhesive and its instruction leaflet.
- 2. The recommended working temperature for the assembly adhesive and the material that is to be bonded (vehicle and components) is between 15°C and 25°C.
- 3. The assembly process should be completed 10 minutes after opening the assembly adhesive.
- 4. The add-on components must be installed immediately after applying the assembly adhesive (observe the reaction time of the assembly adhesive).
- 5. Thoroughly clean the bonding surfaces immediately before installation using benzine and then isopropanol (flash-off time of isopropanol: approx. 5 min). If necessary, remove wax build-ups and underseal prior to this using a plastic spatula.
- 6. The bonding surfaces on the body and the add-on component must be completely dry, clean and free from wax and oil or grease.
- 7. Surfaces must not be contaminated and must not be touched from this point onwards.

1.5 Instructions for raising the vehicle

(!) Caution

Improper use of the lifting platform may cause damage to the vehicle!


- ♦ Do not exceed the permissible load city for the lifting platform.
- Only raise the vehicle at the jacking points shown.
- Align the support plate centrally under the jacking points.
- Maintain clearance between low-lying vehicle components and the lifting platform.

There are a number of ways to raise the vehicle for the purpose of installing the running board:

- Inspection pit
- Lifting platform with holding fixture positioned at the vehicle wheels (recommended)
- Lifting platform with holding fixture positioned at the vehicle body/side member




- The lifting platform support plates must not have a diameter greater than 120 mm.
- There must be sufficient height difference—at least 75 mm between the contact surface of the lifting platform support plates and the upper edge of the support arm.





- ◆ The distance is reduced significantly if the running board is fitted on the vehicle.
- ◆ Position the lifting platform support plates on the specified holding fixtures marked on the underbody/side member.
- ◆ The positions of the jacking points are marked by a stamp on the side member trim.


4.2.1 Removing the noise insulation with underbody trim panel -3-

- Loosen the self-tapping screws -A- and the pins -B-.
- Detach the noise insulation with underbody trim panel -3- towards the rear.



4.2.2 Removing the cross piece trim -4-

- Loosen the self-tapping screws -arrows-.
- Detach the cross piece trim -4- in a downwards direction.




4.2.3 Removing the rear left cover -1-

- Unclip the cover -1- on the rear underbody trim panel using a wedge -3409- and detach it in a downwards direction.

Note

Follow the same procedure to remove the rear right cover.






4.2.4 Removing the rear left underbody trim panel -7-

 Loosen the self-tapping screws -A-, spreader rivet -B- and the remaining plastic nuts -C- on the underbody trim panel -7-.

Note

To allow all of the bolts on the rear underbody trim panel to be loosened, the arms of the lifting platform must be relocated.

- Remove the underbody trim panel -7-.




4.2.5 Removing the rear right underbody trim panel -8-

 Loosen the self-tapping screws -A-, spreader rivet -C- and the plastic nuts -B- on the underbody trim panel -8-.

Note

To allow all of the bolts on the rear underbody trim panel to be loosened, the arms of the lifting platform must be relocated.

Remove the underbody trim panel -8-.




4.2.6 Removing the middle left underbody trim panel -6-

- Loosen the spreader rivet -A-, impact nut -B-, speed nut -Cand self-tapping screw -D- on the underbody trim panel.
- Remove the underbody trim panel -6-.

Follow the same procedure to remove the middle right underbody trim panel.






4.2.7 Removing the front left underbody trim panel -10-

- Loosen the plastic nuts -arrows- on the underbody trim pan-
- Remove the underbody trim panel -9-.

Follow the same procedure to remove the front right underbody trim panel.





5 Preparing the underbody

5.1 Finding/exposing the mounting points

Make sure that the remaining underseal does not peel off from the vehicle.

If the cathodic dip coat becomes damaged: Use two-component wash primer LLS MAX 230 M (applied with a brush or aerosol).

Use a two-component filler LLS MAX 202 M2 on the two-component wash primer (applied with a brush or aerosol).



The contact surfaces to be exposed located around the mounting holes must be clean, free from wax and flat so that the pop rivet nuts rest completely flat. This ensures that the mounting holes are sealed.

Recommendation: test by inserting the pop rivet nuts.



Note

To keep the vehicle sealed, the hexagonal holes in the vehicle are covered using adhesive spots and adhesive tape and in some cases are coated with underseal.

- Remove the adhesive spots -17- and -18carefully.
- The mounting holes in positions -19 and 20are not covered.



🚺 Note

- Only remove as much underseal around positions -11 and 12- as is required.
- ◆ If the adhesive bead in the area of positions -11 and 12- has been damaged in any way, it must sealed using adhesive sealant: AKD 476.KD5.05.
- Carefully remove adhesive tape strips -1 to 16-.

Note

- Only remove as much underseal around positions -1 to 4- as is required.
- ♦ If the adhesive bead in the area of positions -1 to 4- has been damaged in any way, it must sealed using adhesive sealant: AKD 476.KD5.05.






! WARNING

On older versions, it may be the case that mounting points -13- and -14- are not present on the underbody of the vehicle. These must then be retrospectively incorporated.


Observe the steps for retrofitting the mounting points -13- and -14- in Cross reference error: reference link ID='X-6NB1NY' not found.

Inserting pop rivet nuts correctly 5.2

Insert the pop rivet nuts so that they are straight.



Make sure that the pop rivet nuts are positioned correctly



5.3 Preparing the front of the underbody before installing the support parts

- Apply sealing compound AKD 476 KD 505 all around the side member area between the shoulder of the pop rivet nut -28- and the body⇒Page 15.
- Insert the pop rivet nut -28- in the hexagonal hole in the floor
 -A- and rivet using the riveting tool. Make sure that it is in correct position ⇒ Page 17.



5.5 Preparing the rear of the underbody before installing the support parts


Insert the pop rivet nut -28- in the hexagonal hole in the floor

Installing the support parts and the running board 6



∕!\ WARNING

The following description is for installing the components on the left-hand side of the vehicle. Repeat the procedure for the components on the right-hand side of the vehicle, following the same instructions.

Definition of "slightly tighten"

In the following steps, the term "slightly tighten" is frequently used.

This term describes the following process:

Screw in bolt, but do not fully tighten.

There is still some space between the bolt head and the part to be secured so that this part can be subsequently aligned.

Definition of "hand-tighten"

In the following steps, the term "hand-tighten" is frequently used.


This term describes the following process:

Screw in the bolt and tighten by hand.

There should be no air gap between the bolt head the part to be secured. This prevents any accidental movement of the part.



6.2 Pre-assembling the top cover of the support part


- The illustration shows the top cover and middle left support part 2.

- ◆ The top covers for all support parts are pre-assembled.
- Install the top support brace cover -14- on the support part
 -6- using bolt -31-.
- Slightly tighten the bolt -31-.






6.3 Installing the front support part -2-

- Place the front support part -2- on the pop rivet nuts.
- Insert the bolts -26- and slightly tighten them.




6.4 Installing middle support part 1 -4-

Place middle support part 1 -4- on the pop rivet nuts, lightly lubricate the bolts -26- using threadlocking adhesive D. 000.600.A2, insert and tighten to the specified torque ⇒ Page 20.




6.5 Installing rear support part 1 -8-

- Pre-assemble rear support parts -8 and 10-
- Insert the bolts -26- and slightly tighten them.




6.6 Installing the running board


 Place the running board -1- on the support brace and slightly tighten the bolts -27- at the front and rear.




 Screw the hydraulic compensation elements -A- into the pop rivet nuts -B- of middle support part 1 -4- as far as they will go.

- Insert the bolts -26- and slightly tighten them.




Hand-tighten middle support part 2 -6- to the running board




 Carefully screw the bolts -32- into the pop rivet nut -B- without tilting until the hydraulic compensation elements rest on middle support part 2 -6-.

Make sure that both spacers -A- lie flush against middle support part 2 -6-.

Tighten the bolts -32- on the hydraulic compensation element to the specified torque. Do not use any threadlocking adhesive.




Applies to both the right-hand and left-hand side

 Unscrew bolts -26- and -27- individually, insert using locking fluid D. 000.600.A2 and tighten to the specified torque ⇒ Page 20.

6.7 Installing the top support brace cover


The following description of how to install the top cover is given as an example and applies to all six top covers.

- Align the top cover -13- so that it is flush against the side member joint seal -A- -arrows-.
- Tighten the bolt -31- to the specified torque \Rightarrow Page 6.

WARNING

The top cover must not be installed underneath the seal

The top cover should lie flush on the side member joint seal -arrows-.



7 Installing the underbody trim panels

7.1 Preparing and installing the underbody trim panels

Note

Numbered cutting guidelines/templates for the relevant underbody trim panel cut-out are available to download from the ETKA.

- Transfer the specified dimensions of the relevant cutting template onto the appropriate underbody trim panel using a measuring tape/ruler. Tolerance: ± 2 mm. Recommendation for transferring these: use chalk or a marker pen.
- Carefully cut out areas that are to be removed and deburr if necessary.
- Observe the shape of the inserted insulating mat!


7.1.1 Installing the front underbody trim panel

Front left and right underbody trim panel

- Install the speed nut.
- Fit the underbody trim panel -9- and secure the plastic nuts -arrows-.

⇒ Refer to General body repairs, exterior; Rep. gr. 66; Underbody trim panel; Exploded view – Underbody trim panels




7.1.2 Installing the middle underbody trim panel








To allow all of the bolts on the rear underbody trim panel to be tightened, the arms of the lifting platform must be relocated.




8.3 **Concluding operations**

Applies only for vehicles whose equipment includes a jack.

8.3.1 Assembling the spindle sleeve for the jack

- Remove the jack from the luggage compartment.
- Unscrew the jack until the spindle sleeve -2- can be pushed over the jack spindle -1-.






Bend the retaining lugs -3- using suitable workshop tools,
 e.g. combination pliers, to an angle of 45 ° to prevent the spindle sleeve -2- coming loose from the jack spindle -1-.


Note

Ensure that the jack spindle can move freely at all times.

- Clean the bonding surface at the clear space on the top with isopropanol.
- Allow the cleaned bonding surface to flash off for approx. five minutes.
- Attach the enclosed information sticker to the clear space on the top.



- Screw the jack back into the storage position.
- Stow the jack back in the luggage compartment.

8.3.2 Jack adapter storage location

- Place the information sheet regarding using the jack adapter in the glove compartment.
- Stow the jack adapter in the luggage compartment, in the foam section on the left under the luggage compartment floor.



8.4 Installing the jack adapter



To raise the vehicle, use the jack adapter and the jack. Install the jack adapter on the jack \Rightarrow see Information sheet for wheel mounting on the Audi Q5 (glove compartment).
